Over two years have now elapsed since I was elected Police and Crime Commissioner for the Humberside Police force area. As a local resident myself I share many of the same frustrations as you, with a trend of rising crime and increased anti-social behaviour against a backdrop of falling police numbers due to budget cuts from Government. We have examined every aspect of resources and I have released funds tied up in financial reserves to put more officers on the street. By early 2019 Humberside Police will have 300 more officers than it did in 2016 and every area will see its share of those.
